2018 PLAYERS OF THE WEEK - SEPT. 3

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - DANIEL SMITH, CAMPBELL, QB, R-SOPH (LEESBURG, VA.)

Smith accounted for 332 yards of offense and five touchdowns in Campbell's 49-26 victory over Chowan last Thursday night. He was 11-of-20 passing for 260 yards and three scores, and added a team-high 72 rushing yards and two touchdowns. Smith connected with three different receivers on long scoring passes (49, 72, 37), while his two rushing TDs were from four yards out each time. Smith also became the first Big South quarterback in league annals with two TD rushes and three scoring passes in a season-opening contest.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - SHAI THOMAS, GARDNER-WEBB, LB, SOPH (ANDERSON, S.C.)

Thomas scored two defensive touchdowns against Limestone in addition to six total tackles (three solo, three assisted), 15 tackles-for-loss (minus-7 yards) as well as a quarterback hurry. His two scores came on back-to-back possessions and within 1:50 of each other. Thomas first scored on a fumble recovery in the end zone, and on the ensuing drive four plays later, snatched a tipped pass out of the air and outran the Saints for a 41-yard score. It was just the second time in Big South history a player recorded a fumble return TD and interception return touchdown in the same game.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK - KYLE HORTON, GARDNER-WEBB, PR, Sr (CHARLOTTE, N.C.)

Horton returned three punts for 78 yards (26.0 average) to give Gardner-Webb field possession inside Limestone territory twice and near midfield on another. Each return was at least 20 yards (30, 28, 20), while two led to eventual touchdown drives.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK - JUWON FARRI, MONMOUTH, RB, Fr (GERMANTOWN, MD.)

Farri, a reserve running back for the Hawks, rushed 13 times for 111 yards and a score at Eastern Michigan. He averaged 8.5 yards per rush and had five carries of nine or more yards on the night. Farri scored his first collegiate TD on a 3rd-and-4 situation in the fourth quarter when he burst through the middle of the line of scrimmage, broke a tackle and raced 38 yards to the end zone.

FOR OPENERS

Campbell won its Big South football debut last Thursday and is 1-0 for the fourth consecutive year. The Camels will attempt their first 2-0 start to a season since 2016 and third in four seasons. Gardner-Webb is 1-0 for the first time since 2016, and is seeking its first 2-0 open since the 2010 campaign. Meanwhile, Presbyterian College plays its season-opener this Saturday.

BIG SOUTH SET FOR FIRST FCS MATCH-UPS OF 2018

After the opening weekend of Big South football featured three FBS match-ups and two non-Division I contests, the league's Week 2 schedule consists solely of FCS competition. In 2017, the Big South went 16-11 (=59.3 percent) against non-conference FCS opponents in the regular-season, marking the league's fifth consecutive winning regular-season against non-league foes. Since the start of the 2013 campaign, the Big South is 80-43 (=65.0 winning percentage) in regular-season competition and 87-51 (=63.0) when including postseason games in that span.

HOME COOKIN'

Campbell and Gardner-Webb played their home openers last week, and this week Monmouth will play in front of its home fans for the first time. Kennesaw State and Presbyterian play their home openers in Week 3, while Charleston Southern opens its home slate Sept. 22. Below is a look at the last home-opening win and current home-opening streaks for CSU, KSU, MU and PC.

MR. SMITH GOES TO... THE HOUSE

Campbell QB **DANIEL SMITH** accounted for five of the Camels' seven touchdowns in their season-opening win over Chowan last Thursday. He rushed for two scores and passed for three to become the first quarterback in Big South history with 2 TD rushes and 3 TD passes in a season-opening contest. Smith is the conference's first signal-caller with two rushing scores and three passing strikes in a game since **JOSH WOODRUM** passed for three and scored two for Liberty against Richmond in 2014.

INTERSECTION OF FIRST AND FIRST

In Campbell's first official game as a Big South member, **DEONTAE HENDERSON** scored the team's first touchdown of the season on an 84-yard interception return -- the first time a pick-six was a squad's opening TD of a campaign in Big South history. Henderson is the eighth player all-time in league annals with an INT return touchdown in a season opener, while his 84-yard return is the sixth-longest in the conference record book.

THOMAS THE TRAIN

Gardner-Webb LB **SHAI THOMAS** became just the second Big South player with a fumble recovery touchdown and interception return touchdown in the same game when he scored on back-to-back possessions against Limestone in this past Saturday's season-opener. Thomas first recovered a fumble in the end zone caused by teammate **ALEXANDER IKOKU**'s strip-sack at the goal line. On the fourth play of the ensuing drive, Thomas' pick-six went for 41 yards. Gardner-Webb's **MARIO WILLIAMS** was the first with this achievement in 2004 at Tennessee Tech, which was also the Runnin' Bulldogs' season-opener.

OWL ODDITY

For the third time in Kennesaw State's brief history (37 games), the Owls *PASSED* for more yards than rushing in a game. In the season-opener at Georgia State, KSU finished the night with 201 passing yards and 181 yards on the ground. The previous times Kennesaw State had more passing yards than rushing yards in a game were Nov. 7, 2015 vs. Charleston Southern (189-P, 113-R) and Sept. 24, 2016 at Duquesne (312-P, 157-R). The Owls are now 1-2 in such games.

POLL POSITION

Kennesaw State is ranked in both national polls this week -- No. 7 in the STATS FCS poll and No. 8 in the AFCA FCS Coaches ranking. The Big South has had a Top 25 program in 91 of the last 95 polling weeks -- including a streak of 83 consecutive weeks from Oct. 17, 2011 to Oct. 1, 2017. KSU began the week ranked No. 5 in both preseason polls -- which was tied for the highest season-opening ranking in conference annals. Meanwhile, also receiving Top 25 votes this week were Charleston Southern (AFCA), Monmouth (STATS) and future Big South member North Alabama (STATS).

BIG SOUTH NETWORK NOW SHOWING ON ESPN+

The Big South Conference and ESPN reached a seven-year extension to its media rights deal in July that will see close to 1,000 annual conference events carried on ESPN networks -- including a minimum 900 events each year on ESPN+, the first multi-sport, direct-to-consumer subscription streaming service from The Walt Disney Company Direct-to-Consumer & International segment and ESPN which launched in April. The agreement runs through 2024-25, 34 years since the longstanding relationship began in 1991. The comprehensive new deal makes ESPN+ the exclusive streaming home of Big South Network productions. Big South football will still air on ESPN3, and the first broadcast is scheduled for Sept. 29.

BANK ON BURKS

Kennesaw State QB **CHANDLER BURKS** is the Big South's all-time leader for most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback with 27, and is the second Big South signal-caller with 20 career rushing (27) and 20 career passing touchdowns (24). He is on track to become the first player in league annals with 30 career rushing and passing scores. Meanwhile, Burks ranks second on the Big South's quarterback career rushing list with 1,944 yards, and needs 1,006 to break the record of 2,949 set by Gardner-Webb's **TYRELL MAXWELL** from 2014-17. Burks is the Big South's leading active career rusher, and is 56 rushing yards shy of becoming the 24th overall player with 2,000 in a career.

BIG BROWN

Charleston Southern senior DL **SOLOMON BROWN** is tied for sixth all-time with 36.0 career TFL, and ranks tied for seventh with 15.0 career quarterback sacks. Brown needs five sacks to become just the fourth player with 20. His 36.0 career TFL have come in 34 career appearances. Meanwhile, Brown entered the league's 200-career tackle club during the season opener at Florida and now sits at 206 (104-solo, 102-assisted).

MAKING A STATE-MENT

Kennesaw State is playing Georgia State, Alabama State and Jacksonville State in 2018, and the Owls are 4-3 all-time against fellow "State"-named schools, including 3-1 last season. In 2017, KSU defeated Alabama State, Montana State and Jacksonville State, and fell to Sam Houston State. Kennesaw State is 1-1 all-time vs. East Tennessee State and 0-1 vs Georgia State, but its three overall losses to the "State" schools has been by a combined 12 points.

REG-GIE, REG-GIE

Monmouth senior WR **REGGIE WHITE JR.** ranks seventh all-time in Big South history with 186 career catches, and needs 14 to become just the fourth player with 200. His 2,317 career receiving yards rank ninth, while his 20 career touchdown grabs are tied for eighth. White owns five career 10-reception games, the second-most in Big South history behind Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**'s record total of eight. White needs 854 receiving yards to break the Big South record of 3,170 set by Liberty's **DARRIN PETERSON** from 2012-15, and is 10 TD receptions shy of being just the third player with 30 in a career.

POINT OF ORDER

Monmouth holds the Big South's longest active scoring streak at 38 games, just ahead of Kennesaw State's streak of 37 games. The league record is 144.

THREE-LEGGED RACE

Kennesaw State has three players who all could eclipse 2,000 career rushing yards this season. QB **CHANDLER BURKS** is the program's all-time leader with 1,944, followed by teammate RBs **JAKE MCKENZIE** (1,547) and **DARNELL HOLLAND** (1,507). Together, the trio has combined for 4,998 rushing yards and 52 scores. Should the three each reach the 2,000-yard milestone this year, it will mark the first time in Big South history that one school had three active 2,000-yard career rushers. Meanwhile, sophomore RB **SHAQUIL TERRY** is 133 rushing yards shy of 1,000 in his young career, and owns a 12.39 yards per carry average (70 for 867).

HOUSE CALLS

Kennesaw State has won nine-straight home games, dating back to 2016, and in Week 3 will seek to become the first Big South team to win at least 10 consecutive home games since Charleston Southern from 2014-16 (10). KSU went 7-0 at home in 2017 (6-0 during the regular-season), while Monmouth finished its home schedule a perfect 5-0, marking the first time since 2009 that two members finished unbeaten overall at home (including playoffs). It was the second time in three years that two Big South squads went undefeated at home in regular-season games. Kennesaw State was just the third different Big South team to post a 7-0 home record, joining Coastal Carolina (2004 and 2013) and Stony Brook (2012).

HOP, SKIP AND A JUMP

Charleston Southern DB **SHADARIUS HOPKINS** is now fifth all-time in Big South history with 27 career pass break-ups, and needs three to become the fifth player with 30. His 31 career passes defended ranks 11th in league annals. Hopkins is nine away from becoming just the third player with 40 passes defended in a career.

SUPER SUMPTER

Kennesaw State WR **JUSTIN SUMPTER** is three receptions away from 100 in his career, and 232 receiving yards shy of becoming the 15th Big South player with 2,000. His 18.23 career yards per catch is tops in Big South history among individuals with 75-99 career receptions. Meanwhile, Sumpter is two TD catches away from 20, which would make him the 11th player to reach that benchmark.

JAKE, FROM STATE OF NEW JERSEY

Monmouth TE **JAKE POWELL** is tied for eighth in Big South annals for most career catches among tight ends with 40, and is 10 receptions away of becoming the fifth with 50. He is also 10th on the tight end career ledger with 487 receiving yards.

GOOD WORK YOUNG MEN

The Big South Conference is once again represented among the national candidates for the All-state AFCA Good Works Team®, as Kennesaw State's **NICOLAS SNOWDEN** and Monmouth's **RYAN WETZEL** are among the 169 candidates from every subdivision and classification. The Big South has had one honoree named to the team -- Charleston Southern's **JORDAN LANCASTER** in 2010.

KENNESAW STATE LANDS TOP PRESEASON SPOT

For the first time, Kennesaw State is the outright favorite in the annual Big South preseason football poll, as the defending conference champion claimed the top spot in the 2018 preseason ranking as voted by the league's head coaches and media panel. The Owls received 17 of the 18 first-place votes, and begin their title defense Oct. 6 at home against Presbyterian. KSU was the preseason co-favorite in 2017.

ATLANTA DREAM

Kennesaw State is opening and closing the 2018 regular-season with a nod to the Atlanta Braves baseball club. The Owls began the year Aug. 31 at Georgia State in what was Turner Field -- the Braves' home stadium from 1997-2016. GSU now plays in the reconfigured and renamed Georgia State Stadium. KSU will conclude the slate Nov. 17 against Jacksonville State in SunTrust Park, the Braves' new home that opened in 2017.

FIRST TIME FLIPPERS

Gardner-Webb is alternating home and road games each week of the 2018 season -- just the second time in Big South history a member will play such a schedule. Coastal Carolina was the first in 2005. Gardner-Webb almost turned the trick in 2006, as the Runnin' Bulldogs' first 10 football games alternated road-and-home until the final week of the season when GWU concluded the year with back-to-back home contests.

HELLOS

This season features the addition of Campbell University, as the school announced on Nov. 14, 2016, that it will begin scholarship football this fall, and make the subsequent move to the Big South. Campbell is already a full-time conference member, and played its final season of non-scholarship football last year in the Pioneer Football League. While the Big South Conference welcomed the addition of Hampton University as a full member beginning with the 2018-19 academic year, the Pirates' first year of the Big South Football will be 2019. Meanwhile, the University of North Alabama will join Big South Football in 2019 as an associate member, a direct result of the Big South's collaboration agreement with the ASUN Conference in which ASUN members playing scholarship football have an automatic home in the Big South.

GOOD-BYES

Presbyterian College is transitioning its football program to the non-scholarship PFL in 2021, and will play two more years in the Big South (2018 & 2019).
