## OU POSTGAME NOTES

OKLAHOMA 56, TULANE 14 • SEPT. 16, 2017

---

### GENERAL NOTES

- Oklahoma has won 13 straight games, the longest active win streak in the nation. It's the ninth longest win streak in program history and the longest for the Sooners since winning 14 straight over the 2002-03 seasons.
- Saturday was the first ever meeting between Oklahoma and Tulane. OU is 33-10-2 all-time against programs currently in the American Athletic Conference and has won 25 of its past 27 such games dating back to 1970.
- The Sooners are 3-0 to start a season for the fourth time in the last five seasons.
- Lincoln Riley became the fifth head coach in Oklahoma history to start his career 3-0, joining V.L. Parrington (1897-98), Jam Mackenzie (1966), Howard Schellenberger (1995) and Bob Stoops (1999).
- OU is 66-16 all-time as the AP's No. 2 team, including 31-5 in home games. OU has won 16 straight home contests as the No. 2 team.
- Oklahoma held Tulane to just 54 passing yards, the fewest allowed by OU since 2015 (45 at Kansas State).
- With an 82-yard touchdown pass from Baker Mayfield to CeeDee Lamb in the first quarter and an 87-yard passing touchdown from Kyler Murray to Marquise Brown in the fourth quarter, Oklahoma recorded multiple pass plays of 80 or more yards in the same game for the first time in program history.
- Attendance for Saturday's game at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium was 86,290 to mark OU's 112th straight sellout, or every game since the start of the 1999 season. It was the fifth largest crowd in facility history.

### INDIVIDUAL NOTES

#### QB BAKER MAYFIELD

- Threw for 331 yards on 17-of-27 passing with four TDs and no interceptions. He has eight games in his OU career with at least four TD passes.
- Has thrown a touchdown pass in 29 straight games, extending his own school record. He's thrown at least two TD passes in 16 consecutive games (50 TDs to 8 INTs during the stretch).
- Has thrown 15 touchdowns since his last interception, which came in the third quarter at West Virginia last year.
- With 331 passing yards, now has 8,711 in his OU career to move ahead of Sam Bradford (8,403) for second in Oklahoma history.
- Recorded his 25th career 200-yard passing game and 15th career 300-yard passing game, giving him sole possession of second place in OU history in both categories.
- The start was his 29th straight, tying Bradford for the fourth longest streak in OU history. His 29th career start at OU ties Mayfield with Thomas Lott for ninth in OU history.
- Tied Jimmy Harris for fifth in OU history with 25 career victories.

#### RB ABDUL ADAMS

- Finished with eight rushes for a career-high 93 yards and two receptions for 32 yards and a touchdown. It was the first multi-reception game of his career.
- Caught a 20-yard TD reception in the second quarter for his first career score.

#### TE MARK ANDREWS

- His four receptions gives him 63 for a career, which surpasses Joe Jon Finley for sixth in OU history among tight ends.
- With 76 receiving yards, now has 1,040 in his career to become the 34th Sooner and fifth OU tight end to reach 1,000 career receiving yards. He is tied with Jarraill Jackson for 33rd in OU history in career receiving yards.

#### WR MARQUISE BROWN

- Set career highs in receptions (6), receiving yards (155) and scored his first career touchdown on a career-long 87-yard reception.

#### WR CEEDEE LAMB

- Recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game with four catches for 131 yards and two touchdowns.
- Became the first freshman in OU history to record at least 100 receiving yards and two touchdown receptions in one game.
- Had 107 receiving yards in the first quarter, becoming the second freshman in OU history to record 100 receiving yards in one quarter (Joe Mixon registered 115 yards in the 3rd quarter vs. Akron in 2015).

- Set an OU record for receiving yards in a half by a freshman with 131 (record was 115 in the second half by Mixon against Akron).
- His 82-yard TD reception in the first quarter was the longest by an OU freshman in school history. The previous mark belonged to Ryan Broyles, who had a 77-yard reception against Washington in 2008.

#### **QB Kyler Murray**

- His 87-yard touchdown pass established a new career long, surpassing the 43-yarder he had against UTEP in the 2017 season opener.
- The 87-yard score is also tied for fifth longest all-time in OU history for the longest passing touchdown and ranks second longest at home.

#### **RB TREY SERMON**

- Made his first career start, rushing for 23 yards on six attempts, including his first career rushing touchdown.

#### **WR JORDAN SMALLWOOD**

- Recorded his first career TD reception on a 11-yard catch in the fourth quarter.

#### **RB MARCELIAS SUTTON**

- Ran for a career-high 63 yards on seven carries and scored on a 9-yard TD run in the third quarter for his second career rushing touchdown.
- Recorded his first career kickoff return for 18 yards.

#### **DL NEVILLE GALLIMORE**

- Set a career high with nine tackles and assisted on a sack.

#### **S KAHLIL HAUGHTON**

- Set a career high with eight tackles. His previous high was four, done twice.

#### **DL KENNETH MANN**

- Finished with a career-high five tackles and recorded his first career forced fumble, sack and tackle for loss.

#### **LB KENNETH MURRAY**

- Set a career high with eight tackles and recovered a fumble for the first time his career.

#### **LB OGBONNIA OKORONKWO**

- Tied for the team lead with nine tackles, including 2.0 tackles for loss and a sack.
- Has 16.5 sacks in his career to pass Dusty Dvoracek (16.0) for 16th in OU history.

#### **CB PARNELL MOTLEY**

- Recorded a 77-yard pick-six in the second quarter for his first career touchdown. He has both of Oklahoma's interceptions on the season.

#### **K/P AUSTIN SEIBERT**

- With eight points, now has 252 in his career to tie Adrian Peterson for 16th in Oklahoma history.
  - He also now ranks 8th in career points in OU history for a kicker.
  - His eight extra points made passed Tim Duncan for seventh in OU history with 162.
