TEAM NOTES

- In a game that featured the most combined points scored between two teams in OU history, the No. 21/21 Sooners fell 111-108 in overtime to No. RV/20 DePaul on the road Monday at McGrath-Phillips Arena.
- OU's 108 points are the most scored in a single game since the Sooners' scored 117 against Sacramento State on Nov. 13, 2011 in Norman. OU's 108 points are also the most scored by the Sooners in a true road game in the Sherri Coale era.
- The 219 combined points are also the second-most ever in a game involving a team from the Big 12 Conference.
- Three Sooners finished with 20 or more points against DePaul: Vionise Pierre-Louis (25), Shaina Pellington (23) and Maddie Manning (20). It was the first time since Dec. 29, 2010 versus Arkansas Pine Bluff that three OU players finished with 20-plus points: Aaryn Ellenberg (29), Danielle Robinson (21), Morgan Hook (21).
- Six OU players finished in double figures: Pierre-Louis (25), Pellington (23), Manning (20), Gabbi Ortiz (15), Ana Llanusa (10) and LaNesia Williams (10). It was the first time since March 21, 2015, against Quinnipiac that six different OU players scored 10-plus points.
- DePaul's 19 made 3-pointers and 45 3-point attempts set OU opponent records. The Blue Demons' 111 points are also the most allowed by the Sooners in a single game in program history (previous record: 110, by Eastern Illinois, Dec. 8, 1989).
- The Blue Demons lead the all-time series with the Sooners, 2-1. Monday's matchup was the first regular-season meeting between OU and DePaul since Nov. 12, 2006 in Norman.
- OU's starting lineup vs. DePaul -- Maddie Manning (G), Gabbi Ortiz (G), LaNesia Williams (G), Mandy Simpson (F), Vionise Pierre-Louis (C).
- Oklahoma head coach Sherri Coale is 466-228 in her 22 seasons at Oklahoma.

PLAYERS NOTES

FRESHMAN GUARD ANA LLANUSA

- Picked up her first career double-digit scoring game with 10 points on 5-of-12 shooting from the field. Llanusa also had two assists and two rebounds in 18 minutes of action off the bench.

GRADUATE STUDENT GUARD MADDIE MANNING

- Earned fifth career 20-point scoring game, finishing with 20 points on 4-of-10 shooting from the field and 10-of-13 attempts at the free throw line.
- Made a 3-pointer for the 14th consecutive game, which is tied for the fifth longest streak in program history. Manning was 2-for-4 from deep against DePaul.
- Recorded 50th career double-digit scoring game of her OU career.

SENIOR GUARD GABBI ORTIZ

- Earned 40th double-figure scoring game at OU, finishing with 15 points on 5-of-14 shooting from the field, while knocking down three 3-pointers. Ortiz also logged five rebounds, three assists and two steals.
- For the second time in her career, played an entire game without being substituted. Ortiz was the only player from both teams to play all 45 minutes.
- Moved up to eighth all-time in school history with 421 3-point field goals attempts. Ortiz needs just four more treys to crack the top in program history for career 3-pointers.
- Was 2-of-2 at the free throw line, extending her streak of consecutive free throws made to 27.
- Collected three assists against DePaul and needs just four more to pass Britney Brown (320) for eighth all-time at OU in career assists.

FRESHMAN GUARD SHAINA PELLINGTON

- Scored the most points by an OU freshman since 2013, finishing with 23 points on 9-of-12 shooting off the bench. Pellington's 23 points are the most points scored by an OU freshman since Derica Wyatt also scored 23 points against UT-Arlington during the 2013-14 season.
- Made nine field goals, the most by an OU freshman in a single game since Aaryn Ellenberg hit 11 shots versus Baylor on Feb. 27, 2011.
- Led OU with six assists and added five rebounds in 33 minutes of action.

SENIOR CENTER VIONISE PIERRE-LOUIS

- Recorded second-straight double with 25 points and 16 rebounds against DePaul. Pierre-Louis' 16 rebounds tied her career high, while the senior's 25 points are the second-most in a single game during her career.
- Set career highs with three steals and 36 minutes played.
- Added two rejections and now has 149 career blocks, which ranks fourth in OU history.

SENIOR GUARD LANESIA WILLIAMS

- Recorded back-to-back double-figure scoring games for the first time in her career. Williams finished with 10 points on 4-of-8 shooting in 35 minutes.
