TEAM NOTES

- Maddie Manning finished with a career-high 25 points and led the Sooners with eight rebounds, but it was not enough as Oklahoma fell to No. 20/23 Oklahoma State, 96-82, on Sunday in the first Bedlam game of the season. The Sooners fell to 7-8 overall this season and 2-2 in Big 12 play, while Oklahoma State improved to 12-3 overall and 3-1 against league foes.
- The Sooners lead the Bedlam series, 61-41, and are 35-12 against the Cowgirls during the Sherri Coale era. OU is 23-22 all-time against Oklahoma State in Stillwater.
- OU is now 1-4 against AP top-25 teams this season and 0-3 on the road.
- Oklahoma's .450 (9-of-20) 3-point shooting percentage set a season high.
- Through 14 games this season, the Sooners have had five different players combine for 14 20-point scoring performances. Last season, the Sooners had just 15 20-point scoring performances in 33 games.
- Manning's 25 points set a career high, besting her previous mark of 24 against Tulsa on Dec. 11, 2016. The Ankeny, Iowa, native has scored 20-plus points three times this season and seven times in her career.
- Senior center Vionise Pierre-Louis scored 15 of her 19 points against the Cowgirls in the second half. Pierre-Louis was 7-of-14 from the field and 5-of-6 at the free throw line, while recording six rebounds and four assists.
- Freshman guard Ana Llanusa totaled 17 points on the night off of 6-of-14 shooting. Llanusa knocked down three 3-pointers, picked up five rebounds and logged a career-high three assists in her first Bedlam game. The freshman has scored in double figures nine times in 15 games this season.
- Senior guard Gabbi Ortiz added 16 points on 6-of-14 shooting and pulled down five rebounds. Ortiz was 4-of-10 from deep and scored 13 of her 16 points in the second half. The senior has 995 career points and needs just five more to become the 35th player in school history to reach the 1,000-point mark.
- Ortiz's second-quarter trey gave the senior sole possession of fourth place in school history for made 3-pointers. The Racine, Wis., native has 178 career made triples needs just 12 more to pass Morgan Hook (189, 2011-14) for third place at OU.
- Oklahoma head coach Sherri Coale is 472-235 in her 22 seasons at Oklahoma. Coale is 227-125 all-time against Big 12 competition.
- Up next, the Sooners travel to Texas Tech (6-9, 0-4 Big 12) on Wednesday to face the Lady Raiders. OU has won 13 straight games against Texas Tech dating back to 2011. The game will be televised on Fox Sports Southwest +.
